

Passive voice

Form of Passive

Subject + finite form of *to be* + Past Participle (3rd column of <u>irregular verbs</u>)

Example: A letter was written.

When rewriting active sentences in passive voice, note the following:

- a) the object of the active sentence becomes the subject of the passive sentence
- b) the finite form of the verb is changed (to be + past participle)
- c) the subject of the active sentence becomes the object of the passive sentence

Examples of Passive

Tense		Subject	Verb	Object
Simple Present	Active:	Rita	writes	a letter.
	Passive:	A letter	is written	by Rita.
Simple Past	Active:	Rita	wrote	a letter.
	Passive:	A letter	was written	by Rita.
	Passive:	A letter	can be written	by Rita.
